1. Call to Order

3. FFY2020 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment

4. Tulsa County/Rural transitioning roadway safety audit

Mr. Putta asked Chase Phillips to make the presentation, who said the safety audit was north of 56th Street North. Site visits to intersections that had numerous crash incidents. Tulsa County is doing all it can to improve safety at intersections. Concerns are for corridor transitions from rural to urban and

reducing left turns. Assess 35 MPH speed limit when lights flashing for school. Plan to redesign roadway for safer speeds for everybody, with safer turning, including bike lane, drive lane, and center turn lane.

5. Staff Report

- a. TIP Line Item update. Mr. Putta said we get the update from ODOT every month, and they did not have any items to present.
- b. Ozone Alert! Update. Ms. Graham announced the 2019 ozone season was officially over and provided a summary. Of the six national ambient air quality standards, only ozone is our problem. A violation of any standard makes an area eligible for nonattainment. The ozone standard is violated at 71 parts per billion (ppb). Tulsa ended the season with a 67 ppb ozone design value and OKC, with a 70 ppb This season saw two exceedance days and two alert days compared to last year's nine and eleven respectively. All of Oklahoma remains in attainment for Ozone.
