1. Call to Order

3. 2050 Regional Long-Range Planning Process Update & Expansion of the Tulsa Transportation Management Area (TMA)

Mr. Putta explained the process for updating the current regional transportation plan for 2045 as it is a federal requirement that the plan be updated every five years. The plan updation shall be completed before 2022. Year of 2021 will be the focus for the regional transportation plan. It will be data driven. It will be a local decision making process. As a part of the plan the staff is proposing to expand the transportation management area to include Inola, Mannford & Bristow to be considered as a part of the metropolitan region. It is the traffic commuting pattern, employment growth and opportunities are the ones that drive the process to expand and make changes to the regional transportation system.

4. Construction Management & Inspection on Local Public Agency (LPA) Projects

Mr. Putta went over examples of construction management and inspection fees in the region, that are a sample of more recent projects with local project award made by Oklahoma Department of Transportation. Mr. Davis stated that it was a higher cost at the initial stage but the ODOT has combined projects to bring the costs down. Mr. Stevens stated that City of Owasso also had some concerns but ODOT has addressed those concerns. Typically smaller projects tend to experience a higher percent as inspections fees.

5. Tulsa Area Trails Map Update

INCOG Staff Jane Ziegler and Charlotte Adcock presented the newest trail map that is printed on a water resistant paper that is a pocket sized for bicycle users with clear directions.

6. The Tulsa Area Broadband Coverage: An Understanding
